

The course syllabus for  
**Language Arts - 6<sup>th</sup> Grade**

## **Course Description**

Language Arts is a comprehensive course that will take the students through a variety of units covering reading and writing concepts. Reading units will utilize nonfiction and fiction literature. Nonfiction literature will be used to assist students in understanding and identifying the common text structures used in expository text. Fiction literature will be used to review and reinforce comprehension skills and strategies to a proficient/advanced level.

Writing units will focus on grammar and composition skills. Focused practice in key language concepts will include units in vocabulary, sentence structure, grammar and usage, and capitalization and punctuation. Composition units will take students through the writing process as they explore writing for a variety of purposes.

## **Enduring Understandings**

The student will:

1. Demonstrate mastery of the writing process by application of various types of writing: informational, persuasive, and narrative.
2. Read to develop and apply higher level thinking skills in order to interpret and analyze various types of written material: informative, narrative.
3. Apply speaking and listening skills to communicate effectively.
4. Apply knowledge of mechanics, usage, and organization to produce and evaluate writings: grammar, writing traits, and writing process.
5. Locate, document, summarize, and synthesize information using source materials.
